Annual Awards Nomination**

Each year, the Lakeville Lions Club recognizes those individuals who have exhibited their commitment to the principles of Lionism through their participation in and support of the club's programs and projects. In previous years, we usually recognized two Lions through the presentation of a Melvin Jones Fellowship and a W.P. Woods Fellowship. In 2012, we added the Lion of the Year Award. We are asking you to recommend those individuals who should be recognized this year.

The Melvin Jones Fellowship is a program of the Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF). The program recognizes donations of \$1,000 to support the global humanitarian work of LCIF. Recipients of the Melvin Jones Fellowship are usually Lions, however, LCIF does not require recipients to be Lions Club members.

The W.P. Woods Fellowship is a program of the Indiana Lions Foundation. The program recognizes donations of \$500 to support the mission of the Foundation. The mission of the Foundation is to assist Indiana Lions Clubs, sub-districts of Indiana Lions, and the State Projects of the Multiple District 25 to carry out their charitable purposes. Recipients of the W.P. Woods Fellowship are usually Lions, however, the Foundation does not require recipients to be Lions Club members.

The Lion of the Year Award recognizes a Lion whose service to the community exemplifies the Lions Motto: We Serve. A recipient of the Lion of the Year Award must be an active member in good standing of the Lakeville Lions Club.

To recommend an individual for a Melvin Jones Fellowship, a W.P. Woods Fellowship, or the Lion of the Year Award, please complete this form and return it to PDG Paul Russell by Thursday, February 28, 2013. All recommendations will be reviewed by a committee composed of previous award recipients. The committee will make the final decision regarding the selection of award recipients.
