A buffet luncheon will be served at 4:00 p.m. At 5:00 p.m., the Lakeville Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star will present a brief memorial ceremony, followed by a time for family members and friends to share memories of Jane's life.

Although Jane was not a member of our Lions Club, she was a member of our Lions family. She worked on many of our projects and supported the club in many ways, even during the later stages of her illness, and she will be greatly missed.

Jane's eyes were donated to the Indiana Lions Eye and Tissue Transplant Bank.

It's January—the start of a new calendar year and the midpoint of our Lions' year. It seems like a good time to review our accomplishments so far and make plans for the remainder of the Lions' year. At the January board meeting, we heard reports about several recent or ongoing projects, and discussed ideas for some new projects.

Toys for Tots and Christmas Food Basket: 2nd VDG Vic Fischer and PDG Dave Court reported that we provided boxes of food for 70 families and toys for 181 children. Community support for this project is very strong and feedback from the community has been positive.

Pictures with Santa: Lion Howard Heines reported that we had a good turnout at the Library on December 14th. He also noted that we provided pictures with Santa for families who picked up food and toys at the Newton Center on December 21st.

Mobile Food Pantry: PDG Dave Court reported that we had plenty of volunteers for the most recent Mobile Food Pantry visit on January 3rd, but that the turnout was quite a bit lower due to the harsh weather.

Operation KidSight: PDG Paul Russell reported that the vision screening team took a month-long break during the Christmas holiday season, but that several vision screening sessions are scheduled over the next few weeks. He encouraged Lions to contact Lion Jean Barlow to volunteer to help with this ongoing project.

Spaghetti Dinner: Lion Anne Weber reported that planning is underway for a Spaghetti Dinner fund-raiser which will be held on Friday, March 21st.

Good Friday Fish Fry: Lion Bob Court reported that planning is underway for our annual All-You-Can-Eat Fish Fry, which will be held on Good Friday, April 18th.

Snow Removal: PDG Paul Russell presented a proposal for a new service project suggested by Lion Dave Grenert. When there is a significant snowfall, Lakeville Lions Club members will provide free snow removal service for town residents who are unable to shovel their own walks and have no one else who can shovel their walks for them. Members who volunteer to work on this project would provide their own equipment and supplies, at their own expense. The proposal was approved by a voice vote and PDG Paul volunteered to work with Lion Dave to work out the details.

Dues: The club has paid District, State, and International dues for all current members for the 2013-2014 Lions year, however, several members have not yet paid their dues.
