- The annual 4-H fair food booth fee is due in the amount of \$3,720. This is the same as last year.
- The board voted to donate to the 5 state projects and the Indiana Foundation for a total of \$1,500 @ 250 for each.
- The vision screening machine will be at our February dinner meeting and we are trying to recruit more members to work this worthwhile project.
- Lakeville Lions are trying to work with LCI to promote LEO clubs in our district. A local club in Lakeville is part of that plan.
- Our snow committee will be working with the Fire Department and town garage on a way of marking the fire hydrants.
- The awards committee has put together a list of recommended criteria for the Melvin Jones Fellowship, WP Woods Fellowship and Lion of the Year Award. It has been discussed to maybe add one more of our own club. Remember that these do not have to be given annually, but can be earned and deserved.

Four major events are coming in the next few months and we need every lion and their helpers for these projects to be successful.

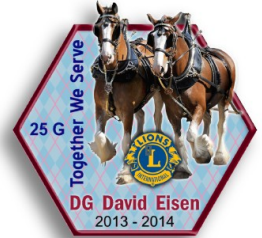
