Feb. 8th Board of Directors Meeting:

- Lion Max Feitz commented on the gently used walk-in that Marge Newton Skaggs has decided to generously give to the Club to replace the aging walk-in freezer at our 4-H Fair food booth. Marge's brother, Terry Newton, first asked her about the possibility of the donation. The donation of the freezer is another example of the various ways the Newton family supports our Lions Club. It is going to take some major construction to our Fair Booth to accommodate the replacement cooler and we may need outside construction expertise.
- ❖ We have scheduled the Good Friday fish fry on April 15th from 4 to 7 o'clock (drive through only). This is a joint project with the Lakeville Volunteer Fire Department and the drive through is at the Fire Department. The price of fish has more than doubled from one year ago to \$4.99 per pound which requires us to raise our ticket price to \$12.00. I can not emphasize enough how much help we need to make this project a success! Watch for more information about ticket sales and the opportunities to serve!
- ❖ The Good Friday Fish Fry Menu will be fish, fries, coleslaw, and cookies. The projects managers, Lions Tiffany Schieber, Max Feitz, and J.D. Ort have also set October 8th for a joint tenderloin fry with the Fire Department.
- ❖ Lions Jim Tibbs and Darlene Shock have volunteered to manage the Strawberry Festival project in North Liberty June 11 − 12. That same weekend, on Saturday, Jim Tillman will manage the "Relay for Life" project at the 4-H Fair Grounds. We will need roughly 4 to 6 individuals for each of these projects. Keep your calendars open on that weekend.
- ❖ The Board donated \$250.00 to the LaVille After Prom event at the high school. Last year over 142 individuals attended the event held in the high school gymnasium.
